



Call for Applications

Donald Mosher Award for Colonial Virginia Research Annual Deadline: 20 February

The Board for Certification of Genealogists Education Fund, a Massachusetts charitable trust, is pleased to announce the Call for Applications for the annual Donald Mosher Award for Colonial Virginia Research. The \$500 grant, established in 2001 by Merrill Hill Mosher, CG, of Coos Bay, Oregon, in memory of her late husband, funds scholarly research on Colonial Virginia topics. The winner will be announced at the National Genealogical Society Conference.

Entries may fall into one of the following three categories:

Family genealogy, meeting the following criteria:

- The genealogy begins with a couple who lived in Virginia during the 17th or 18th century, with some descendants living in colonial Virginia for at least three generations.
- All male and female descendants of the couple are traced for at least three generations.
- Families are placed within the historical context in which they lived.
- The genealogy has not been published, and the work is fully documented using original sources.

Study of immigrant origins which

- Focuses on a 17th century Virginia immigrant whose origins have not been documented.
- Connects the immigrant to his family of origin.
- Documents and explains all steps in the research that proves the connection.

Publication plan for a project that

- Makes available obscure or difficult unpublished Virginia resources from the 17th or 18th centuries.
- Includes an outline and plan for the project.
- Presents a sample of the projected format.

- Details publication plans, either print or Internet, and sets a projected completion date within eighteen months of the submission.
